



AMOROUS ANACAONA:

Anguilla's oasis of affordable chic presents the kind of Valentine, Romance, Honeymoon, Vow-Renewal, Whatever Package that lasts for decades.

(Anguilla, February 4) Anacaona's regular rates are already good value – from less than \$300 double in winter -- but with this special package guests can cut their vacation budget even more and still enjoy all sorts of extra perks.

Into the bargain, you don't have to pay the local government tax or service charge – they're both taken care of in the rate: just \$2,950 for two for 7 nights, valid through April 8, 2012 (low-season rates kick in on April 9, when you can book an Amorous Anacaona vacation for just \$2,185 anytime until December 21).

But that's not the only money-saving offer from Anacaona Boutique Hotel. Here are three more. The rates shown are valid through April 8 but the packages are also available from April 9 through December 21 at off-season rates. Rates for suites are higher in each case.

"Anacaona Getaway 2012": 4 nights, \$1,520 for two (standard room) -- a breakaway package that includes 4 nights, with local tax and service charge, continental breakfasts daily, two candlelit dinners for two in Firefly, welcome rum on arrival and a bottle of wine in your fridge.

"Pay 6, Stay 7": Stay six nights in a standard room and the 7th night is on the house. That's a \$1,750 value but you pay

only \$1,500, making your \$250 room just \$180 a night for two. In winter!

Also included with your 7 nights in a standard room are the local tax, service charge, continental breakfasts daily and a welcome rum beverage.
